Endemic to the sheep industry, soremouth is the most common skin disease affecting sheep (and goats). It is caused by a virus in the pox family. Soremouth is characterized by lesions (or blisters) on the mouth, lips, noses, and sometimes other areas of the body. Zoonotic diseases are contagious diseases that spread between animals and humans. It is estimated that approximately 75% of recently emerging infectious diseases affecting humans are diseases of animal origin; approximately 60% of all human pathogens are zoonotic. Sheep (and goats) can get scrapie, a fatal, neurological disease that is in the same family of diseases as "mad cow" disease (bovine spongiform encephalopathy), chronic wasting disease (of mule deer and elk) and classic and new variant Creutzfeld-Jakob's disease (affecting people). Clinical signs associated with sinusitis may include some or all of the following: unilateral or bilateral, serous to mucopurulent nasal. This can result in a progressive debilitation in sheep and goats with or without obvious clinical signs of respiratory disease. Parasitic or verminous pneumonias of sheep and goats are most commonly caused by infection with *Dictyocaulus filaria*, *Muellerius capillaris*, or *Protostrongylus rufescens*. Sheep diseases can be bacterial, viral and parasitic, furthermore traffic of material and deficiency diseases, limb, medical, genital diseases, as well as intoxications. 1.
