Most of his plays were part of trilogies; the only extant Greek trilogy is The Orestia. He is Believed to have introduced the 2 nd actor (Thespis was one, the 2 nd added; after 468 B.C. Sophocles is believed to have introduced the 3 rd actor, which Aeschylus then used. Euripides was another Greek tragedian. He wrote about 95 plays, 18 of which have survived completely and

many more as fragments. His most known works are Alcestis, Medea and The Bacchus.
