"What's important for me in a film is that it be alive, that it be imbued with presence, which is basically the same thing. And that this presence, inscribed within the film, possesses a form of magic. Rivette's 'eulogy to poverty' is a recurrent theme in his writings in the 1950s; see, for example 'Letter on Rossellini' (1955) [available on Order of the Exile] and particularly his contributions to the 'Six Characters in Search of auteurs' discussion (1957).
