Material remains: Material remains mean physical evidence of human habitation, occupation, use, or activity, including the site, location, or context in which such evidence is situated. It is one of the core concepts in archaeology, the academic discipline concerned with documenting and interpreting the archaeological record. Archaeology is the study of the ancient and recent human past through material remains. It is a subfield of anthropology, the study of all human culture.
