Pieces of wood of varying shapes, colour and sizes are arranged in highly ordered ways to form patterns that are ever surprising and constantly varied, yet peculiar to each individual slacker. STACKING WOOD — HOW TO STACK FIREWOOD

The Right Way to Stack Firewood. The hard part is over. You've cut down the trees and split the resulting wood. Now it's time to stack all those pieces in an orderly, efficient, attractive way so. Since colonial days, wood cut from trees too small to saw into lumber has been bought, sold, and traded by the cord — 128 cu ft of 4-ft-long logs and air in a stack 8 ft long and 4 ft high. When stacking a large amount of wood, always consider making multiple stacks rather than creating a single large stack. If your firewood has been sitting around for a while waiting to be stacked, be sure to check each piece of wood for signs of mold or other fungi prior to adding it to the stack. This video will show you how to stack firewood without supports on the ends using this simple log cabin technique. There is an art and a science to building a firewood pile. "Wood heats twice" as you work up a sweat chopping, splitting and stacking, and again when you burn it. Actually your wood will dry fastest exposed to direct sunlight, but in wet environments it is best to cover it. Firewood stacking may seem like a simple job, and it is, but learning how to stack firewood can give you better quality firewood to burn and save you from a lot of unneeded work and potential problems. A steady supply of firewood can help offset your heating costs and, unlike oil and coal, is a renewable resource that can be replanted for future fire-burning pleasure. How To Stack Firewood - Ideas Unless you're stacking directly on concrete you should start off by laying a couple 2x4's on the ground parallel to each other about 12-14 inches apart. 2x4's work good because they get the wood off the ground and they are inexpensive. The stacks are totally uncovered to allow maximum wind exposure. Try to stack your wood with the bark facing up, as bark helps to keep the water from entering the grain of the wood and it will shed rain much more easily. Why stack firewood? Stacking is necessary to dry out wood that is not yet seasoned. If you have green wood that was recently cut, it must be dried to burn efficiently. dry. The best way to stack wood. Get loads of advice on how to stack and store your firewood. By giving your firewood the best drying conditions, you will make the most out of your firewood. Stacking your wood creates a pile with a smaller footprint, requiring less storage area, and a neatly stack pile looks nicer than a random pile. Stacked firewood also keeps more of the wood off the ground so it can get better air circulation, which helps to keep the wood dry and clean. Neatly stacking wood, when working alone, means each piece may be handled two or even three times depending on the circumstance. That means, if my math works like I think it does, splitting and tossing is two to three times faster than splitting and stacking when working alone, which I am doing. A cord of firewood is a rectangle of stacked wood that is 4 feet wide by 8 feet long by 4 feet high. It contains about 128 square feet of wood. Stacking the wood keeps the wood off the damp ground and allows air to circulate between the logs to prevent mold and rot.
