Once we had peeled off the balloon they used a teaspoon to pour small amounts of salt over the balloons, this would melt the balloon in the areas it touched and cause cool little rivers of salty ice to appear. Fill your balloons with water until they are about ten centimetres in diameter. Squeeze any excess air out of them before tying them and putting them in the freezer. When frozen peel away the balloon and you will have your truly beautiful ice balloons.
