## **'A RIGHT TO HAVE RIGHTS': HANNAH ARENDT AND THE OUTLINES OF A**

The relationship between statelessness and the denial of a "right to have rights" was the central theme of Chapter Nine of Hannah Arendt's 1951 book *The Origins of Totalitarianism*. 1951 was a key year for Arendt: It was the year she became a naturalized U.S. citizen, after having herself been stateless for 18 years. More recently, 21 other states that have passed constitutional amendments bestowing the right to hunt and fish, including neighboring states Georgia, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. Who is alleged to have the right: Children's rights, animal rights, workers' rights, states' rights, the rights of peoples. What actions or states or objects the asserted right pertains to: Rights of free expression, to pass judgment; rights of privacy, to remain silent; property rights, bodily rights. This is another area that—this is court made law; so they are not just automatically given to you, you have to invoke your rights. And you have to be unequivocal. If a person says, "I think I need an attorney," the court very likely will phrase that as you did not actually invoke your rights. Minors also have rights under the U.S. Constitution. Specifically, they have the right to equal protection, which means that every child is entitled to the same treatment at the hands of authority regardless of race, gender, disability, or religion. Patient rights include the right to make decisions regarding medical care, the right to accept or refuse treatment, and the right to formulate advance directives (written instructions, such as a living will or durable power of attorney for health care as recognized under Louisiana state law, relating to the provision of such, when an individual. If you have been Mirandized and you waive your rights, meaning you wish to speak to police freely without an attorney present, you can change your mind at any time and 'plead the fifth,' meaning you no longer wish to answer questions, or that you have changed your mind and wish to have an attorney present after all.
