Therapies addressing trauma use various modalities within the context of the vital therapeutic relationship and the client's developmental history, and attempt to develop client awareness around relationships between defensive dynamics, wishes, and fears, named by Frederickson in 1999 as the 'triangle of conflict' (p. 22).³⁷ Notably, what is considered normal is subjective and largely influenced by cultural factors that affect the prevalence, impact, and healing process related to trauma, and make using a multicultural framework for working with trauma survivors imperative. McLeod (2011) conducted a similar meta-analysis of the relationship of therapeutic alliance and treatment outcome in youth psychotherapy, and reported similar relationships. A different research approach to studying the role of therapeutic alliance in influencing controlled context of the therapeutic relationship helps clients face and gain control of the fear and distress that they previously experienced as overwhelming. For example, issues of safety dominate the lives of sexual assault victims.

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
